Finance

At the end of the financial year December 2025 our Income from Offerings; Tax Refund; Donations; Fundraising; and Hall Lets was £56,128. Last year it was £57,445, not a great difference. However, our expenditure was £86,265; a Deficit of £30,137. Last year our deficit was £13,194.

On the plus side, we received £21,447 from Edinburgh to reimburse us for the expenditure at the St. Columba building. This has been deducted from the money raised by the sale. We were also refunded £4,692 for the St. Columba insurance policy. We also withdrew £6,940 from the Central Fabric Fund for repairs and maintenance to the Church and manse. This changes the deficit to a surplus of £2,942.

Our greatest expenditure this year has been gas and electricity which has increased by £10,000 this year. The Church of Scotland changed our provider from SSE to Eon-Next and our gas and electric are now around £2000 per month.

The building at St. Columba sold for £280,000, less fees and deductions we will receive £241,498 into the Capital Fund held at Church of Scotland. Hopefully this will enable us to future proof the building to deal with the exorbitant heating costs. We already hold £331,000 in Capital Funds. Any expenditure requires permission from Presbytery and Edinburgh.

Our membership has reduced and most people are not in a position to increase their offerings at this time. The Pastoral Care team have been wonderful in doing some fundraising, for which we are so grateful.
