A message from our Minister

As I write this message Easter is past and I am preparing worship for the first Sunday after Easter - we will be thinking about Thomas's encounter with the risen Christ.

I am aware that we will be close to Pentecost by the time the magazine is distributed and you are reading this.

Already, in the first week after Easter the congregations right to call a minister has been restored by Presbytery and I am absolutely delighted.

By the time you read this that will be old news and I hope we are several stages ahead on the pathway to your next ministry.

Sometimes it can seem like nothing ever changes or moves, other times it feels like we can't keep up with the rate of change.

Over the year I have been interim minister sometimes it seemed like nothing was changing in the church - now it seems like so much change is happening all at once. However, things were always moving: we said goodbye to old friends and hello to new faces, we did the ordinary work of church and tried out new things.

There is a verse in the bible that says

The Way Ahead

Many of you must be wondering where we are going and what has to be done to move towards reinstating our "Right to Call".

There are a few stages we still have to go through, but most involve me reading edicts at the correct time. We have started this with the first reading to create an Electoral Register, with the second taking place one week later.

A lot of groundwork has gone into this with the creation of the most up to date church roll we have and the creation of a supplementary roll. This puts us slightly ahead of schedule and after the meeting with the Presbytery's Vacancy Procedure Committee, we should be allowed to appoint a vacancy committee, advertise the position and create a parish profile.

Most of what is to be done will be carried out by the Session, but when called upon, you as a member, will be informed and asked to propose and select a nominating committee.

We still have a reading of the 2nd edict which I hope you will be done by the time this newsletter reaches you. The session also has to approve a Parish profile, which is almost complete. The congregation will be asked to select a Nominating Committee, place an advert for applications. Hopefully this can all be done before the end of May.

Finance

We ended last financial year in December 2024 with a surplus of £6855. At the end of March 2025 our income was £27004 and our expenditure £29343; a deficit of £2339. Hopefully, now that the seasons have changed more people will come back to Church and our income will increase.

We are extremely grateful to the Pastoral Care Team who have been holding events in aid of Church funds and to everyone who comes for a cuppa after Sunday service.

Our bank balance is currently £26903 and there is £4000 in national savings bonds.

Investments: We currently have £300,291 in Capital Fund and £10,000 in Revenue Fund held at 121. There is also an amount of £249,726 to be added to the Capital Fund from the sale of the St. Columba Church buildings.

There is a need for some major works to be done at the Church and manse so we are in a good financial position to carry these out.

Property Update

Storm damage; as you may be aware the roof of the main sanctuary was badly damaged with a large section of the apex line being torn away completely! We were able to gain the services of a local roofing contractor who was able to provide temporary repairs and carry out a survey of further damage, in total there was approximately 20m of roof line that required to be repaired and over 250 slates replaced on three of the roofs. The cost of the repairs was circa £13k and thankfully this has been covered under our buildings insurance policy.

Church, halls and manse; minor repair works/maintenance and grounds care continue to be carried out by volunteers and we give our thanks for their time and energy in carrying out these works.

As we move towards calling a minister, we are now looking at carrying out some small works/upgrades to the manse to ensure it is ready to welcome a new resident and also to the halls to make them more inviting to visitors, these should be taking place in the next few months.

As noted in the last Quinquennial property report undertaken by the Church of Scotland, a larger scheme of renovations to the fabric of our sanctuary and halls suite is required to both inside and outside, and this is something that will need to be looked at and costed in the coming years to ensure that we are fit for local mission in our parish.

Clyde Presbytery incorporates the old Paisley, Greenock, Inverclyde and Dumbarton presbyteries.
